These serve as indicators to the college of what intervening factors may be most salient as students begin their careers. 9:45 am-10:15 am	STEM-ing the tide. Should institutions change CIP codes to boost international enrollments?	The Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) provides a taxonomic scheme that supports the accurate tracking and reporting of fields of study and program completions activity. CIP was originally developed by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) in 1980, with revisions occurring in 1985, 1990, 2000, 2010 and 2020. This is a presentation illustrating the changes in IPEDS CIP Code reporting in the Completions survey between 2010 and 2019. The author hypothesizes that there have been institutional strategic changes driven by the need to classify programs as STEM in order to increase international student enrollment. NWCCU reporting requirements necessitated us to develop dashboards to display our mission fulfillment framework. I will cover design considerations, our design evolution, technical aspects of how the dashboards were built, and considerations to keep in mind when uploading to Tableau Public from a Canadian perspective. The workbooks were designed to display all indicators and information within a core theme in a simple and clear manner. We accomplished this by applying our departmental style guide and Tableau's functionality around parameters, dashboard layers, sheet swapping and tool tips.
